13 Objections to Mandatory Online Age Authentication

- 1) Authentication invades consumer privacy
- 2) Children will devalue privacy
- 3) Data disclosures create security risks
- 4) Children will cheat the authentication
- 5) Children will switch to riskier Internet areas
- 6) Children won't prepare for their digital futures
- 7) Children blocked from beneficial Internet usage
- 8) Some heterogeneous subpopulations hurt by the compelled blocks
- 9) Authentication increases services' costs & reduces their revenues => exit
- 10) Reduced competition among publishers/services = higher costs, lower quality, less dynamism
- 11) More paywalls, deeper digital divides
- 12) Loss of unattributed speech
- 13) Infrastructure will be coopted for increased government surveillance and control
